What's Happening at CFFM?

e continue to move forward to achieve our goal of becoming "Canada's National Fire Fighters Museum". In September, we official announced our fundraising campaign. Over the next two years, we're set to raise \$2,500,000 to facilitate the move to a larger, more comprehensive, climate controlled facility in the Port Hope area. As most of our members already realize, the present facility on Mill Street South, in Port Hope, which has served us well for over 28 years, is simply too small and lacks the climate control we need to adequately protect our heritage items and allow us tobe open year-round.

We have appointed fund raising professionals who have been hard at work on grants and fund raising activities in the area. And our fund raising consultants have put together a team of local business people to help with this big job.

So far, the results are very encouraging and we have been able to win grant monies from several organizations and business as well as generous donations from individuals and businesses. It seems when you represent Canada's fire fighting heritage and the heroic efforts of our firefighters, people are very willing to dig deep!

We'll keep you posted on our fundraising progress!

New Addition to the CFFM Artifact Collection:

e continue to acquire important and interesting artifacts that fit our criteria of fire fighting related equipment and paraphernalia made or used in Canada.

Even though space is limited and we are facing a move in the foresee-able future, curator, John Downs often is presented with acquisition opportunities he cannot refuse! In fact, the board has recently asked that any new acquisition be carefully considered on the basis of whether or not it will make a significant addition to our collection and thus must be acquired in spite of the coming move.

This was recently the case when we were offered an immaculately restored ladder truck of the late forties. Although we have one that's similar, it is in need of restoration at a possible cost of \$80,000. The truck we are offered is restored and it is FREE! In a case like this, the obvious solution is to get the restored truck and "de-accession" the other one. But there's more to consider here: this restored truck will require secure storage for at least a year—and it's 53 feet long!

At present, we just do not have the space at the museum so we are searching for storage at another location. Make no mistake, we want this truck, but only if we can adequately protect it.
